Compare and Contrast: Developed vs. Developing Countries

This month in World Geography this unit is all about the economy and the differences between developed and developing countries. If the United States is a developed nation, then what makes us developed? If Senegal is a developing country, then what makes it a developing country? These questions will guide you in creating graphs that contrast the GDP/capita of developing countries with the GDP/capita of developing countries. In addition, you will create at least three more graphs contrasting access to essential needs of the people of differing countries.

Step One:

Create a bar graph contrasting the GDP capita of the United States with the countries on your research chart.
